The stucco pattern also provides a perfect solution in housing developments and neighborhoods where the architecture and landscaping are not uniform throughout. The neutral pattern blends in easily, lending a unifying element that does not compete with varied architectural themes or styles. In fact, many landscape architects prefer the simplicity of a stucco pattern because they feel that it provides a clean, blank canvas for showcasing their design work.

The benefits of Verti-Crete's precast stucco fences extend beyond their practicality for use in architecture and landscape design. The innovative design of Verti-Crete precast stucco fences makes it a much stronger, more durable option than typical stucco fences for several reasons. First, Verti-Crete fences are composed of individual precast posts and monolithic concrete panels. The posts and panels are joined together by tongue-and-groove joints at every post; each post is set on a pier footing. Conversely, typical stucco is applied over the surface of a mortar block wall with a continuous footing.

The first advantage to Verti-Crete's design is that the solid concrete panels are impervious to the peeling, flaking, and mold growth that occur when moisture becomes trapped between the stucco and the base wall of a typical stucco fence.

Verti-Crete fences are also less vulnerable to the destructive effects of shifting or heaving soil. Because each tongue-and-groove joint serves as a natural expansion joint within a Verti-Crete fence, the individual posts and panels of the fence are able to shift and settle without causing the fence to buckle. Typical stucco fences with their continuous footings, on the other hand, are highly susceptible to the cracking and buckling that can occur in fences installed in expansive soil.

All these advantages combine to ensure that your Verti-Crete fence will look pristine and new for decades to come. And if you should ever be faced with the unlikely task of repairing your Verti-Crete fence, the process is much simpler and faster than repairing a typical stucco fence. Simply replace the individual affected panels—it's as easy as sliding out the damaged panel and sliding in a new one. You completely bypass the hassle of matching stucco colors, blending patched spots with the rest of the fence, or repairing structural damage to the wall beneath the surface layer of stucco.

Verti-Crete is also much more efficient and cost-effective to install than typical stucco fencing.
